Consent Items

4. City of Bakersfield Animal Care Center

\$250,000

Kern County

To consider the allocation for a grant for subsidized, public spay/neuter surgeries for 1200 dogs through partner organizations like SNIP Bus and through in-house surgery clinics at the animal care center.

5. Kern County Animal Services

\$238,200

Kern County

To consider the allocation for a grant to continue the KernSAFE Program, a grassroots outreach initiative led by field officers from Kern County Animal Services. The grant funding will subsidize spay and neuter surgeries through a partner mobile clinic in addition to issuing free microchips to pet owners. Additional funding will be allocated to marketing and promotion of the program and subsidized surgeries with the goal of preventing pets from being surrendered to the shelter.

6. City of Avenal \$301,920

Kings County

California for All Animals Advisory Council Meeting Preliminary Agenda

To consider the allocation for a grant for a three-year period for subsidized spay and neuter surgeries for dogs and cats in the Avenal service area. The shelter will partner with local veterinary clinics to provide subsidized surgeries as well as rabies vaccines and microchips.

7. Madera County Animal Services

\$58,000

Madera County

To consider the allocation for a grant to subsidize veterinary care for approximately 200 sick or injured stray animals through partner veterinary clinics. In addition, waiving fees and other related expenses for owners seeking to reclaim their pets from the shelter, waiving or lowering adoption fees, veterinary care expenses for owned animals to prevent surrender to the shelter, and purchasing pet supplies for the shelter.

8. Riverside County Animal Services

\$200,000

Riverside County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support the 5,000 Cat Challenge initiative by subsidizing spay and neuter surgeries for cats that will be returned to their habitats. The funding will subsidize expenses for a minimum of 2,000 cats.

9. San Bernardino City Animal Shelter

\$8,650

San Bernardino County

To consider the allocation for a grant to purchase supplies for the shelter's volunteer and foster programs in support of increasing capacity. Supplies will be provided to fosters and volunteers in support of the shelter's mission.

10. City of Tracy Animal Services

\$10,000

San Joaquin County

To consider the allocation for a grant to partially subsidize the spay and neuter surgeries of 58 dogs.

11. Lodi Animal Services

\$12,000

San Joaquin County

To consider the allocation for a grant for the Lodi Animal Services Enrichment Program for shelter animals to include compensation for a behavioral trainer, equipment and supplies.

12. Turlock Animal Services

\$10,000

Stanislaus County

To consider the allocation for a grant to provide spay and neuter surgeries for 100 cats through partner veterinary clinics.

13. Porterville Animal Shelter

\$89,740

Tulare County

To consider the allocation for a grant to reduce shelter intake and prevent the pregnancies of cats and dogs in the community by subsidizing spay and neuter surgeries. Grant funding to subsidize surgeries for 1300 cats and dogs and to purchase cat traps for use by community members.

14. Chula Vista Animal Care Facility

\$50,700

San Diego County

To consider the allocation for a grant to subsidize return to home fees and assistance for pet owners reclaiming pets from the shelter. To purchase a pet tag engraver and associated supplies to provide free ID tags and dog collars to community members. To subsidize marketing and

community outreach expenses to ensure community members are aware of and using the free services.

15. City of Shasta Lake Animal Shelter

\$50,000

Shasta County

To consider the allocation for a grant for the Pawsitive Futures Initiative: Ensuring Responsible Canine Care that provides subsidized spay and neuter surgeries and other veterinary care services. The grant funding will also allow the City of Shasta Lake to promote the program and host community events.

16. Siskiyou County Animal Control

\$68,329

Siskiyou County

To consider the allocation for a grant to purchase a customized animal control body to be mounted on a vehicle owned by the animal control agency. The purchase of a vehicle will allow this shelter located in a rural area to transport animals to partner clinics for veterinary care and spay and neuter surgeries.

17. Fieldhaven Feline Center

\$50,000

Placer County

To consider the allocation for a grant to subsidize the spay and neuter surgeries for cats in the Trap Alter Manage Invest (TAMI) program that will also include medical care. The grant funding will support the purchase of equipment for trapping the cats.

18. Hayward Animal Services Bureau

\$155,000

Alameda County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support the Trap Neuter Return (TNR) program to reduce unwanted births and reduce the number of cats entering the shelter, and expand program accessibility by offering free spay and neuter services for community cats.

19. Oakland Animal Services

\$200,000

Alameda County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support subsidized spay and neuter surgeries for community cats through existing contracts with external veterinary partners. Funding will also subsidize spay and neuter surgeries for animals in the shelter through existing contracts with external veterinary partners. The grant will cover urgent veterinary care for owned animals to prevent the surrender of the animal to the shelter.

20. Plumas County Animal Shelter

\$180,000

Plumas County

To consider the allocation for a grant to subsidize the spay and neuter surgeries of animals adopted from the shelter. Surgeries will be performed by external veterinary care partners.

21. Nine Lives Foundation

\$50,000

San Mateo County

To consider the allocation for a grant to offset the salary and expenses for veterinary and support staff for the spay and neuter clinic.

22. County of Santa Clara Animal Services

\$6,820

Santa Clara County

To consider the allocation for a grant to subsidize the fees for return to home of owned pets housed at the animal shelter.

23. Silicon Valley Animal Authority

\$27,280

Santa Clara County

To consider the allocation for a grant to subsidize veterinary medical care, mileage and fuel for transport to external veterinary care partners and to support the staffing of outreach positions and registered veterinary technicians.

24. WAGS Pet Adoption

\$75,000

Orange County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support the Return to Home program that subsidizes return to home fees and veterinary care services for owned pets at the shelter. Grant funding will also partially subsidize the salary and training for support staff as well as marketing, outreach, printing and translation services. Shelter supplies, office supplies and software fees will be included in the scope of work.

25. Irvine Animal Center

\$40,000

Orange County

To consider the allocation for a grant to subsidize the Enhanced Care Program and Special Situations (Medical) program. The Enhanced Care program funds the treatment of animals that have been neglected or injured and brought to the animal shelter. The Special Situations program subsidizes veterinary care for owned pets to prevent surrender to the animal shelter and to keep pets in the homes that already care for them.

26. North Bay Animal Services

\$100,000

Sonoma County

To consider the allocation for a grant to subsidize veterinary medical care including spay and neuter surgeries and fees for boarding, return to home, and adoptions to increase positive outcomes of animals from the shelter. The grant will also subsidize microchip and vaccination clinics as well as equipment and supplies.

27. Grass Valley Animal Control

\$40,000

Nevada County

To consider the allocation of a grant to support the purchase of supplies and equipment for the sheltering of animals. Grant funding will also provide partially subsidized veterinary care and spay and neuter surgeries for owned pets in the community.

28. City of Huron Animal Services

\$75,000

Fresno County

To consider the allocation of a grant to support the subsidized spay and neuter surgeries for community members through external veterinary partners.

29. Humane Society of Silicon Valley

\$250,000

Santa Clara County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support a Bootcamp program to train surgeons in High Quality High Volume Spay/Neuter (HQHVSN) through a high-intensity, hands-on training program for private practice and shelter veterinarians.

30. Fresno County Department of Health

\$450,000

Fresno County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support the purchase of a Clinic in a Can spay and neuter unit to be installed at the Fresno County Animal Shelter. The grant will also include surgical equipment, medical supplies and subsidized spay and neuter surgeries through external veterinary partners.

31. Siskiyou Spay Neuter Initiative

\$170,000

Siskiyou County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support the subsidized spay and neuter surgeries for dogs and cats owned by community members. The grant would also fund the spay and neuter surgeries for cats and dogs housed in and cared for by the shelter.

32. Los Baños Animal Shelter

\$80,000

Merced County

To consider the allocation for a grant to subsidize spay and neuter surgeries through external partner veterinary clinics. The grant funding will include the purchase of surgical supplies and costs associated with hosting community outreach events.

33. Gimme Love Animal Shelter

\$164,945

Fresno County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support subsidized spay and neuter surgeries for owned cats and dogs in the community through external veterinary partners.

34. Humane Society of Imperial County

\$60,000

Imperial County

To consider the allocation for a grant to subsidize the spay and neuter surgeries and other medical care for owned animals through external veterinary clinic partners. And to purchase supplies and equipment to transport animals to the partner clinics.

35. City of Sacramento Front Street Shelter

\$53,500

Sacramento County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support the Homeless Outreach and Assistance program that provides subsidized services for unhoused community members with pets. The program provides subsidized spay and neuter services and other veterinary care for owned pets. The grant funding will allow for the purchase of additional surgical supplies, vaccines, and microchips.

36. City of Moreno Valley Animal Shelter

\$75,200

Riverside County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support the spay/neuter program at the shelter on Saturdays. Grant funding will cover salary and expenses for veterinarians, veterinary technicians and other staffing support to conduct surgeries at the Moreno Valley Animal Clinic

37. El Dorado County Animal Services

\$50,000

El Dorado County

To consider the allocation for a grant to support a field services program to keep pets in homes instead of surrender or seizure. The grant funding will allow the shelter to purchase supplies and equipment for animal control officers to distribute to pet owners. In addition, subsidized veterinary care and other services will be offered to pet owners through this proactive program.
